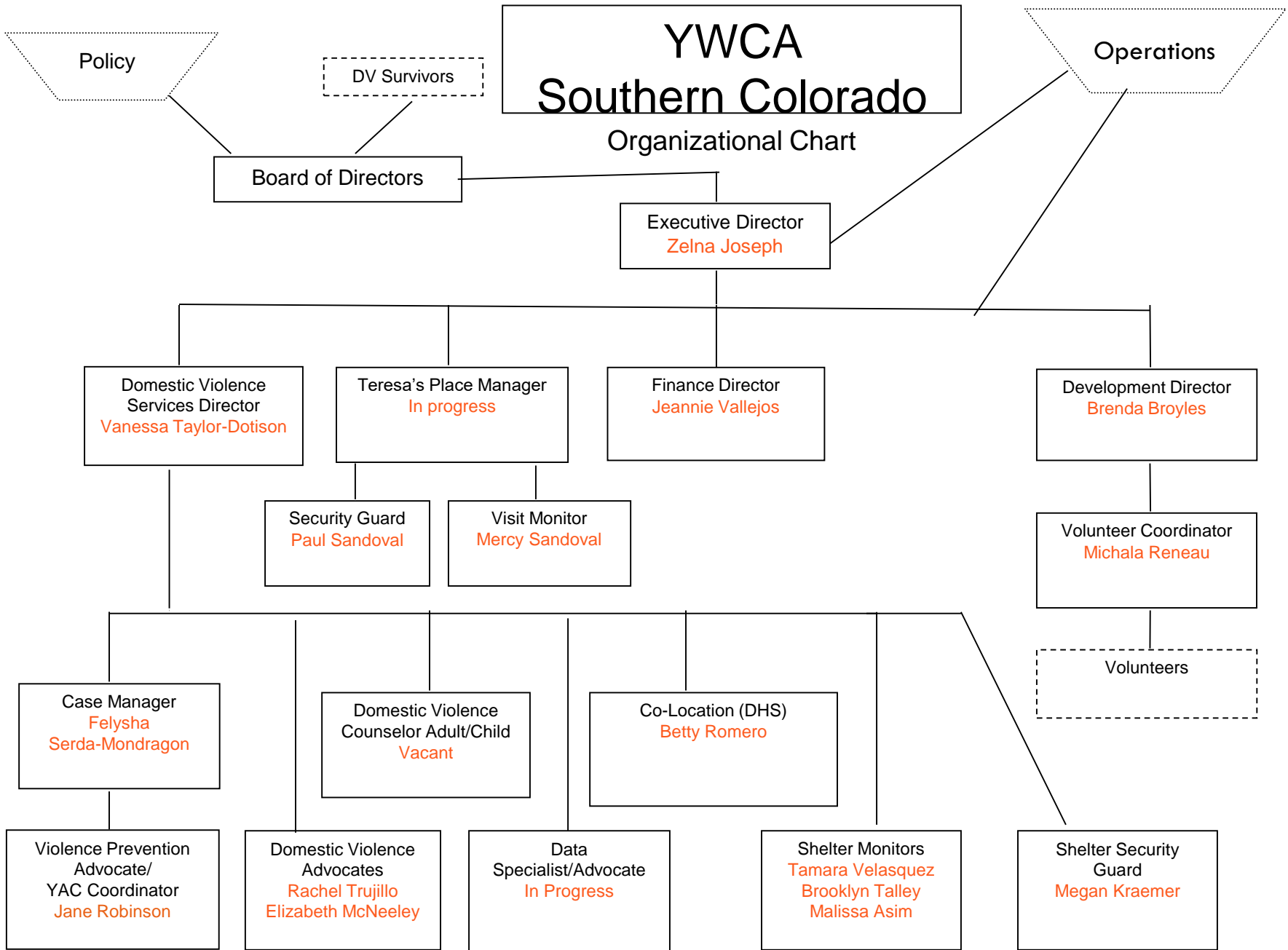

- Screens incoming applicants for history of DV
 - ▣ Identifies any barriers to self-sufficiency
 - ▣ Community resources/referrals
- Trains DHS employees on dynamics of DV and red flags



Healthy Relationships/Safe Dates

- Youth violence prevention curriculum delivered to middle and high school students throughout Pueblo County
- Help teens develop healthy relationships
- Understanding of dynamics of domestic violence and identifying red flags
- Access to community resources/referrals
- Recognize difference between a controlling or abusive relationship vs. a healthy one
- Prepares teens with skills to prevent violence
